CONTINUING EDUCATION

Continuing education, also known as adult education, includes all types of courses that adults take after completing their formal education at university or college. These courses can help you develop personal interests (such as hobbies) or achieve work-related goals (such as computer skills). Continuing education is offered by school boards, colleges and universities, usually in the evenings or on weekends.

LANGUAGE TRAINING

School boards, colleges and community agencies offer government-funded language classes in English and French. Universities and private language schools also offer language courses, but these courses require a fee.

- Specialized Language Training (SLT)
